This means that MBBS graduates must actively seek out and complete specialized courses that offer comprehensive, hands-on training that aligns with the highest standards of care.

This indicates a recognized pathway for specialists within dentistry to engage in these procedures, provided they have the requisite specialized education. However, the field is marked by ongoing legal challenges and debates between dentists and dermatologists regarding the precise eligibility and scope of practice for aesthetic surgeries. For instance, the [Karnataka State Dental Council \(KSDC\) issued a notice](#) clarifying that dentists performing facial aesthetic treatments and hair transplant procedures *outside the scope of their professional training* would be considered "Unethical Practice," potentially leading to license suspension. This situation highlights the importance of adhering strictly to the defined curriculum and obtaining specific, verifiable training for any aesthetic procedure undertaken.
